

Breast implants are not lifetime devices. The longer patients have them, the greater the chance they will develop complications, which may require more surgery. ADVERSE REACTIONS







Breast implants are not lifetime devices. The longer patients have them, the greater the chance they will develop complications, which may require more surgery.
